| | QUESTION | ANSWER |
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| 1. | How do we find out which birds are native to the area? | Several resources exist to learn about native birds visiting the Curtin Creek area, here are a few: <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Ridgefield National Wildlife Refuge has a list of birds that are found on that site. Not all birds would be native on this list. https://www.fws.gov/refuge/ridgefield/species?category=%5B%22Birds%22%5D2. Cornell University hosts eBird, a website that helps explore local bird sightings around the world. Use their "hotspot" tool to look up local bird sightings near Curtin Creek Community Park. https://ebird.org/hotspots. Use the explore page to learn more about species, their nativity and dispersion https://ebird.org/explore.3. Reach out to the Bird Alliance of Oregon (https://birdallianceoregon.org/) for more information about local bird species. |
| 2. | Will the artist have help with hoisting the sculpture into place? | Artists should assume hoisting equipment and an operator will be made available for hoisting the art piece into place at the direction of the artist. |
| 3. | Is there a defined shape for the foundation? | There is not a defined shape for the foundation, however, the artist should assume that the foundation ends at grade level. Any pedestal or concrete above grade would be a part of the sculpture created by this artist. |
| | Will there be lighting to show off the artwork? | There are currently no plans for lighting in the play area as the park will be closed at dusk. Should this change, consideration for lighting will be addressed at that time. |
| | What kind of sports fields will there be? | Both fields are planned for a combination of rugby and soccer. The sport courts will include pickleball, futsal and basketball. |
| | Do you want drawings or explanations of who we are and what we want to propose? Should it all be on paper? No models are needed? | Proposals should show that the Artist has reviewed the Request for Proposal, understands general information about the project, goals of the artwork, etc. Please review the RFP submittal requirements including Section IIB Proposal Submission which provides requirements for the proposal and Section IIC covering Proposal Content. Section IIC includes information about an Artist's statement and that it is acceptable to provide a vision or sketched version of the proposed artwork you would like to see based on the project goals. |
