EMS Administrative Board Bios

Mike Plymale, Chair (Financial Rep.)

Mike Plymale has over 27 years of experience in municipal/non-profit and public accounting. Over the past 17 years, he has been operating his own accounting practice in Vancouver, Washington.

After receiving his degree in Business Administration from Washington State University, Mr. Plymale began working in Clark County's Accounting Department. He later assumed Chief Accountant responsibilities before leaving to start his own practice.

Mr. Plymale has served on a variety of professional and civic groups, some of which include: Washington Society of CPAs; BARS Local Government Advisory Committee to the State Auditor; Intergovernmental Audit Forum; Member and past Chairman to the Clark County Mental Health Advisory Board; East Vancouver Child Care Center Board of Directors; and Habitek Consortium.
