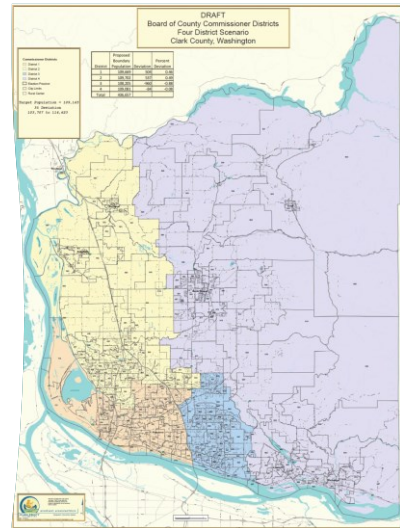

Clark County Home Rule Charter: Background

- Drafted by Board of Freeholders
- Approved by 53% of voters: 2014
- Enacted 2015
- First Review after 5 years (now)
- Charter Review Commission Elected 2020
- Seeking public input on amendment proposals



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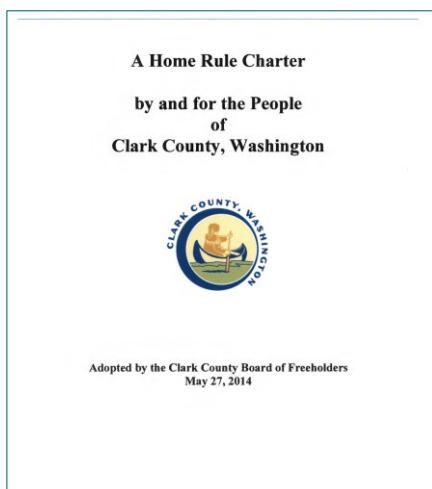

What is the County Charter?

Charter 2014



- "Constitution and structure" of county government
- Spells out the powers, duties and relationships of government
- Strengthens the rights of citizens
- Defines representation and elections
- Provides for direct role of citizens in county government

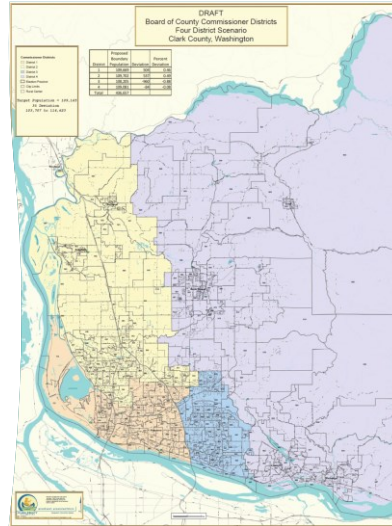

County Charter Key Items

Charter 2014

- **Separation of Powers:** Executive vs. Legislative Branches
 Section 2.6A, Non-interference clause
 Section 7.5, Recall
- **Power to the People:** Initiative, Referendum, Mini-Initiative
- **Direct Representation:** Four districts nominated & elected by district, plus at-large Chair (countywide), all Partisan
- Chair serves on any board with 2 or more Council members (RTC, C-TRAN, others)

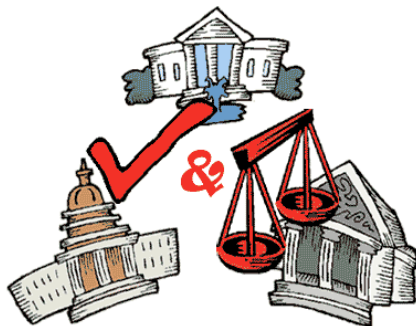


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Separation of Powers

Charter 2014



- **Legislative:** County Council (5 members)
 - Four elected by district
 - Council Chair elected countywide*
- **Executive:** County Manager (appointed by Council); Assessor, Auditor, Clerk, Prosecuting Attorney, Sheriff, and Treasurer
- Staff reports to Executive branch
- Council cannot interfere with staff, but they can still talk with constituents

* Only Charter county in WA state who elects Council chair



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Power to the People

Charter 2014

- **Initiative:** Petition to put ordinance on the ballot
- **Referendum:** Refer something County Council has passed onto the ballot
- **Mini-Referendum:** Petition for County Council to hold public hearing on an issue

What is a Charter Review?

Charter 2014



- **Charter Review Commission:** 15 members, 3 for each Council position, 1-year terms
- **Review:** first review after 5 years (this one), then every 10 years
- **Vote:** Charter Review Commission refers amendment proposals to voters, November ballot

1. Clarity/Consistency/Administrative Clean-up Provisions

2021 Proposal

Five years in, the Charter Review Commission proposes minor, technical changes to improve the clarity and readability in parts of the Clark County Home Rule Charter. These changes would correct clerical errors and some updates to contemporary language.

- Should the Charter Review Commission forward a clarity/ clean-up measure to this year’s ballot?
- Additionally, should this include direction to the county’s Redistricting Committee to avoid splitting of precincts by district boundaries in crafting the Redistricting Plan?



2. Non-Partisan Elected Positions

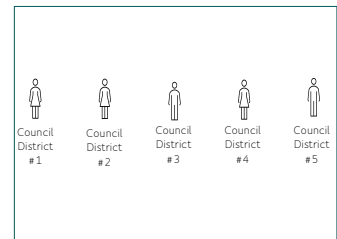
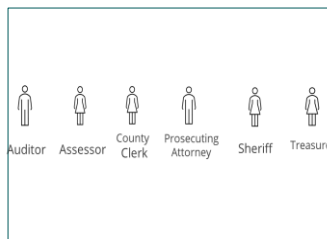
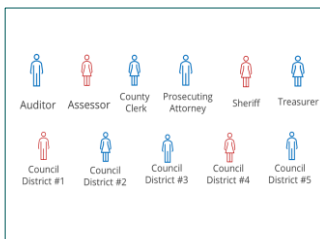
2021 Proposal

Clark County elected positions are currently Partisan (i.e. Republican, Democrat, etc.).

Current: All Partisan

Should the Executive elected offices (Assessor, Auditor, Clerk, Prosecuting Attorney, Sheriff and Treasurer) become non-Partisan?

Should the County Council offices become non-Partisan?





3. Charter Review Frequency & Terms

2021
Proposal

The next Charter Review will be in 10 years. Charter Review Commissioners are elected to 1-year terms.

- Should Charter reviews be more frequent, such as 5 years instead of 10?
- Should Charter Review Commissioners terms be up to 2 years instead of 1?

4. Ethics Oversight

2021
Proposal

Currently, the County Council has a Code of Ethical Conduct as part of their Rules of Procedure. There is no specific Code of Ethics currently to govern elected and appointed officials.

- Should there be an Ethics Code in the Charter?
- Should an Independent Ethics Oversight Commission be appointed to handle ethics complaints and ensure compliance?
- Should the county establish an Ethics Oversight and Compliance office that coordinates ethics training, ethics compliance, ethics oversight issues and staffs the ethics commission?

5. Diversity, Equity & Inclusion Oversight

2021
Proposal

This proposal intends to improving accountability and public trust in Clark County's operations and services related to diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI) best practices.

- Should there be a new position or office within Clark County government that drives, advises and coordinates DEI efforts?
- Should the county create a DEI advisory board or commission?
- Should we look at a combination of 1 and 2?

6. Increase Council Districts from 4 to 5

2021
Proposal

The Clark County Council consists of four (4) representative districts elected within each district, and a Council Chair elected countywide. The Charter Review Commission is considering a proposal to increase the number of Councilor districts to five (5).

This proposal would:

- Replace the countywide chair position with a fifth district Councilor
- Revise the four-district map to five districts (see maps, next two slides)
- Revise the Charter related to Council composition and Council Chair accordingly
- Council Chair would be appointed each year from and by the five Councilors.

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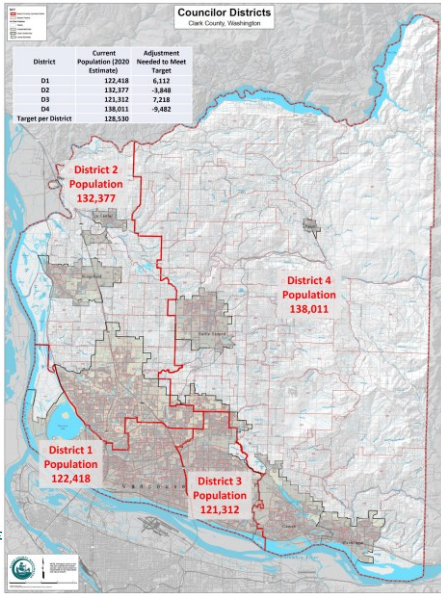
