  - i) Justin suggested cut stump treatments use loppers and then immediately treat with broadleaf herbicide follow the label cut stump appears to work better than applying to leaves as the leaves are waxy and the chemical tends to roll off you would need a sticker and penetrant
  - ii) Denielle also suggested drill and fill in the late fall
