	QUESTION	ANSWER
1.	I just want to clarify that this is for one round of inspections, not three years from now.	This is this is a six-year contract so that would include two rounds of inspections and I it also mentions the ability to extend for a third inspection. The date for that would be September 1st this year until August 31st, 2029 for that initial six years.
2.	Will we need protective equipment for tomorrow's site visit? Or are we free to come more or less as is?	Yes, we will provide the high viz vest, safety glasses and a hard hat. We just asked that you wear closed toed shoes or boots.
3.	The RFP mentioned these assessments being done in 2021. When was the last time they were done prior to 2021?	That was the first time we'd had that the done by an outside engineering firm, and it was completed as part of the sessions were completed as part of the regional system study that we're just wrapping up.
4.	Will you be issuing task orders, or are you asking for a price up front here to do these assessments?	The contract will be set up in a task format similar to any other engineering contract in Washington state. We cannot ask for price or cost with a request for proposal.
5.	Will the county be able to provide a record of drawings for all the sites? Just so we have an idea as far as the number of assets involved in this.	The facilities were built in 91 and 93. I don't know that we've still got the As-Built or not. That has to come out of the current owners, Waste Connections, Columbia Resource Company.
6.	is it required or will you require us to create As-Built drawings?	We did not write that in the scope of work, so that will not be required.
7.	Who's the best contact for the onsite visit tomorrow?	When I emailed the UM schedule, I included both my phone number and Joelle's. So if one of us doesn't answer, hopefully the other one.
