<u>Clark County Homelessness and Veteran's Housing Update</u> (Dale Whitley and Scott Thacker, Council for the <u>Homeless)</u>:

- HMIS (Homeless Management Information System) = Database which compiles data from coordinated entry, outreach, shelter, and housing programs.
 - Uses HUD's definition of homelessness.
- Annual System Number trends on Veteran Homelessness in Clark County
 - In 2022, 6% of people experiencing homelessness, 5% of people calling for rent assistance, 6% of people who asked for shelter, 6% of people who accessed shelter, 10% of people who were housed through

diversion, and 7% of people who entered a housing program were Veterans.

- In 2021, 6% of people experiencing homelessness, 5% of people calling for rent assistance, 6% of people
 who asked for shelter, 7% of people who accessed shelter, 9% of people who were housed through
 diversion, and 5% of people who entered a housing program were Veterans.
- Veterans counted through outreach projects
 - o June 2022-May 2023: 60 total veterans, 31 chronically homeless, 29 non-chronically homeless, 62% 55+
 - June 2023-May 2024: 46 total veterans, 22 chronically homeless, 24 non-chronically homeless, 54% 55+
- · Veterans counted in emergency shelters
 - June 2022-May 2023: 51 total veterans, 23 chronically homeless, 28 non-chronically homeless, 63% 55+
 - o June 2023-May 2024: 44 total veterans, 21 chronically homeless, 23 non-chronically homeless, 50% 55+
- Veteran By Name List (VBNL)
 - VBNL workgroup meets bi-weekly to discuss how to rehouse each veteran
 - The # of veterans changes monthly due to inflow and outflow
 - o Goal is "Functional Zero": outflow is greater than inflow
 - o On Oct 1, 2022 146 veterans were on VBNL with decrease throughout year
 - o On May 1, 2024, 72 veterans were on VBNL with slight decrease throughout year
 - VBNL core improvement team: partnership between CCVAC, TPI/SSVF, VA, PIC, and other local popper fits
- Q&A
 - Q: Is there any info about a 5th safe stay community? A: No information yet.
 - Q: Do these numbers account for homelessness veterans seen at the CCVAC? A: Yes, and any
 disconnect is due to differences in the definition of homelessness between CCVAC and HUD.
 - Q: Do you have someone going out and finding veterans in the community? A: Yes
 - Q: How many outreach programs are there in Clark County? A: Many. CFTH, Columbia River Mental Health, Impact NW, Exchange, etc.

April 2024, Contractor & Fund reports

- CCVAC: 55 Veterans served in April, services totaling \$27,076. 48 male veterans, 17 female veterans. 0 other veterans. 13 definials, 0 subject to appeals. 620 visits to the center for essentials and food, 875 sack breakfasts/lunches provided and 38 food boxes provided. 2872 total pounds of food. 813 volunteer hours, totaling \$32,748 in value.
- Free Clinic: 15 Veterans served in April. Services totaled \$3,179 in value; billed \$1,826.43
- VAC Fund: April revenue: \$315,758; expenditures: \$94,162; fund balance: \$716,474

Clark County Veterans Assistance Center Update

- Gala is July 16th. A lot of service organizations have not bought tickets or made donations. Hope to see some of all of you there.
- Stand Down: Met new DevOp Lever from WorkSource who will be participating.
- CCVAC has been talking with NAMI about obtaining a collaborative workspace. NAMI needs to move shortly. If
 they find a space, CCVAC will need to ask the board for \$3,000-\$4,000 more per month for rent. Looking
 space with ~12,000 sq. ft. with storage, kitchen, and conference room.
- Q: Do you borrow money from anyone and what is your debt? A: No, CCVAC is on reimbursement only.
- Q: Would the board be interested in seeing the total CCVAC expenses beyond just VAF? A: Potentially, CCVAC will need to get this approved by their board.
