  - Busy start to the year
    - ~3000 customer increase from last year
    - ~5% increase
  - Send crews out around the transfer stations to clean up
  - o Busy on educational side in April
  - Yacolt cleanup last week
  - o Ridgefield cleanup a couple weeks ago
  - Increased homeless activity around dumpsters
  - o Acquired Pioneer Recycling, including MRFs

# III. Vape and Battery Outreach Update – Camille Shelton and Mackenzie Hagedorn (\*00:46:20) Battery Disposal Outreach

- Battery drop off locations at several hardware store locations
- Flyer with disposal map provided
- Drop off locations accept batteries in designated box
- Toolkit provided to locations
- Extensive outreach campaign
- Composter/Recycler volunteer training
- Outreach materials provided at outreach events

#### Vape Disposal Outreach

- Targeted approach to 300 retailers within county
- Digital campaigns planned
- Also plan in person material distribution
  - o Window clings
  - Posters
  - Flyers

#### IV. Community Hub Composting Presentation – Pete DuBois and Celina Montgomery (\*01:08:11)

- Congregation to Community Composting Hub transition
- Pilot began as a residential program
  - o At home composting not available to all county residents
- Enrolled churches to host composting bins to their congregants
  - Congregants would bring in food scraps to churches
- Has been successful enough to spread to other commercial businesses
  - Commercial facilities employees only
  - Community hubs available to anyone
- Looking to have more community hubs, and expand commercial to community
- Food waste has been largely contamination free
- Food waste is sent to Dirt Huggers for composting
- Weekly reporting helps determine successes, and needs
