DEAB Recommendations

Joint use areas like those associated with schools, which provide recreational opportunities to the community, should count towards meeting the park plan goals

Many areas listed in the parks plan such as; Open space/Greenway facilities, trail complexes, and Special facilities/sports fields are not counted towards meeting the Acreage goals of the parks plan. These areas should be counted because they provide recreational opportunities in the community.



DEAB Recommendations continued...

- The plan needs to strike a balance between providing recreational opportunities and providing for affordable housing. By implementing the recommendations listed above, the capital requirements and associated PIF's may be able to be reduced.





PAB Recommendation

Increase goals for level of service. Current goal is 60% of National Standard and we're currently not meeting that expectation.



Joint Recommendations

- Look into developing smaller more innovative parks
- Private “pocket parks” in developments should be open to the public and counted towards total park inventory moving forward
- Allow developers to apply for credits based on an agreed upon standards created by PAB and DEAB
- Explore a 2 tier credit system
- Collaborate more in park development/ land purchases
- Provide PIF credits for trails
