REQUESTED ACTION:	Approve the submittal of grant application 20-1680C to the Washington State Recreation and Conservation Office for the development of a trail connecting Camp Currie to the Lacamas Heritage Trail.

BACKGROUND

Clark County, the City of Camas and Columbia Land Trust have worked for over twenty years to establish a greenway around Lacamas, Round and Fallen Leaf Lakes and to develop a 7-mile trail loop around the lakes. Almost 900 acres have been acquired and almost 4 miles of trail have been developed to date to realize this vision. This grant, if funded, will enable an additional 1.2-mile trail connection between new city acquisitions along the East side of Lacamas Lake, through the county's Camp Currie property, across Lacamas Creek and connect with the existing Lacamas Heritage Trail on a 14-acre property that is owned by Columbia Land Trust that will be transferred to county ownership. The grant will also fund construction of a 100-parking space regional trailhead on a 23-acre city property immediately across Leadbetter Road/Northeast 232nd Avenue from Camp Currie.

COUNCIL POLICY IMPLICATIONS

The State Recreation and Conservation Office requires governing bodies of jurisdictions submitting grant applications to approve the attached resolution authorizing the submittal of grant application 20-1680C. If the grant is awarded, Council will be requested to approve a grant agreement in 2021 after adoption of the state budget.

ADMINISTRATIVE POLICY IMPLICATIONS

A draft grant application has been submitted in the state's PRISM electronic grant application system. Technical completion deadline for the grant application is August 10, 2020.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

Both the City of Camas and Clark County Comprehensive Parks, Recreation and Open Space plans identify the Camp Currie to Lacamas Heritage Trail as a priority. Extensive outreach efforts solicited input into the plans and helped shape the priorities. In 2019 and the first quarter of 2020, the City of Camas completed a Legacy Lands visioning process for the north shore of Lacamas Lake, working with an advisory group of city and county personnel, park commissioners, landowners and recreation interests. The Camp Currie to Lacamas Heritage Trail was among the priorities called for in the conceptual master plan completed through this process.

BUDGET IMPLICATIONS

State grant funding decisions will not be made until July 2021. Preliminary project rankings may be available by December 2020. If preliminary rankings indicate that 20-1680C is a competitive project, a decision package will be included in the 2021 supplemental budget.

Part I: Narrative Explanation

I. A – Explanation of what the request does that has fiscal impact and the assumptions for developing revenue and costing information

Request \$2,440,014 in grant funding through the Washington Wildlife and Recreation Program – Trails category to construct the Camp Currie to Lacamas Heritage Trail through Camp Curry including a 100-parking space regional trailhead on City of Camas property and a bridge crossing of Lacamas Creek. Local match is \$1,440,014 comprised of \$986,746 Camas contributions and \$453,268 Conservation Futures. The Camas contributions are not monetary. They purchased the trailhead property under a waiver of retroactivity and, therefore are counted toward the local match. This contribution is excluded from the figures, below. If the grant is awarded, funding will not be available until 2021. Project will be completed by December 31, 2024.

3	state grant assistance to aid in financing the cost of acquisition and construction of outdoor

5	WHEREAS, any grant assistance received by Clark County pursuant to the requested aid
6	through the WWRP will be used for direct costs associated with implementation of the projects
7	referenced herein; and
8	WHEREAS, Clark County expects that the county's matching share of project funding
9	will be derived from Conservation Futures Funds, Real Estate Excise Tax Funds and partnership
10	contributions, and that pursuant to WAC 286-13-040 (3) the county must certify the available
11	match at least one month before funding approval; and
12	WHEREAS, Clark County will be responsible for supporting all non-cash commitments
13	to this project that do not materialize; and
14	WHEREAS, Clark County acknowledges that the grant assistance if approved, will be
15	paid on a reimbursement basis, and that pursuant to the terms of the grant, Clark County will
16	only request payment from the RCO after incurring eligible and allowable costs and remitting
17	payment to our vendors, and that pursuant to the terms of the grant, that the RCO will hold
18	retainage until the project is deemed complete; and
19	WHEREAS, Clark County acknowledges that any property owned by Clark County that
20	is developed, renovated or restored with grant assistance must be dedicated for the purpose of the

21	grant	in perpetuity after the project is complete unless otherwise provided and agreed to by Clark



We understand and acknowledge that if offered an agreement to sign in the future, it will contain an indemnification and legal venue stipulation and other terms and conditions substantially in the form contained in the sample Agreement and that such terms and conditions of any signed Agreement shall be legally binding on the sponsor if our representative/agent enters into an Agreement on our behalf. The Office reserves the right to revise the Agreement prior to execution.

In addition, our organization understands it is responsible for supporting all non-cash matching share commitments to this project should they not materialize.
- 10. Our organization acknowledges that if it receives grant funds managed by the Office, the Office will pay us on only a reimbursement basis. We understand reimbursement basis means that we will only request payment from the Office after we incur grant eligible and allowable costs and pay them. The Office may also determine an amount of retainage and hold that amount until all project deliverables, grant reports, or other responsibilities are complete.
- 11. Our organization acknowledges that any property acquired with grant assistance must be dedicated for the purposes of the grant in perpetuity unless otherwise agreed to in writing by our organization and the Office. We agree to dedicate the property in a signed "Deed of Right" for fee acquisitions, or an "Assignment of Rights" for other than fee acquisitions (which documents will be based upon the

Office's standard versions of those documents), to be recorded on the title of the property with the county auditor. Our organization acknowledges that any property acquired in fee title must be immediately made available to the public unless otherwise provided for in policy, the Agreement, or authorized in writing by the Office Director.

- 12. Our organization acknowledges that any property owned by our organization that is developed, renovated, enhanced, or restored with grant assistance must be dedicated for the purpose of the grant in perpetuity unless otherwise allowed by grant program policy, or Office in writing and per the Agreement or an amendment thereto.
- 13. 


Project Description
