Dear Clark County Voters,


If you are an Absentee Voter I hope you received this Voters' Pamphlet before you received your ballot. In September, for the first time Washington voters received a Primary Voters' Pamphlet which included candidates for Federal, State and Legislative offices. The Primary Pamphlet was a first for the Secretary of State's Office and they picked a very challenging year to begin. The process was not without its growing pains, one of which was a later delivery of the Pamphlet. Many people expressed disappointment that their absentee ballot arrived before the Voters' Pamphlet. Now that the Secretary of State's Office has gotten over the hurdle of creating the first Primary Pamphlet, I anticipate future pamphlets will arrive at the usual time. In an attempt to minimize the chance of absentee ballots arriving before the Pamphlet we are taking extra steps to try and ensure that voters receive their ballot before the Voters' Pamphlet.

As more and more people turn to the World Wide Web for information, candidates are increasingly using it to get their message out to voters. This year we assisted with this by referring candidates to a website <http://washingtonvoter.org/clark.html> where candidates can place a link to their campaign websites. A link to this location, as well as other election information can be found at the Elections Department website at <http://www.co.clark.wa.us/auditor/Election/HomePage.html>. In the future voters' pamphlets we intend to provide more information about how voters can access the candidates, including any candidate website.

Because of these experiences I am an even stronger advocate for the Voters' Pamphlet. We will continue to work hard to provide information to voters in this and other forms to help them with their decisions.

Finally I would like to thank those people who have taken the time to let me know of their concerns, as well as the occasional compliment, about the way in which elections are conducted in Clark County. Please keep those calls, comments, letters and e-mails coming!

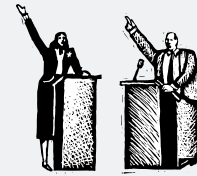

Candidate statements

County Commissioner – District No. 1

The three-member Board of Clark County Commissioners sets policy, makes laws and is responsible for adoption of the county budget and its oversight. Except for county functions managed by other elected officials, the board is responsible for supervising all county departments including the departments of Public Works, Community Development, Community Services and Corrections. Commissioners also make appointments to various citizen committees and advisory boards.

Commissioners file for office by district and must live in the district in which they file. They are voted on by district in the primary and elected at large at the general election. Commissioners serve four-year overlapping terms.

Betty Sue Morris

Democrat



First elected to the County Commission in 1996, Betty Sue Morris has been an energetic, effective leader on budget, juvenile justice, government accountability, and natural resource issues. Her second term priorities are fiscal restraint, maintaining a robust economy, meeting new state and federal environmental mandates, and balancing good land use planning with private property rights.

An outspoken advocate of parks, ballfields and youth services, she also raises a strong voice for law enforcement, open government, family wage jobs and affordable housing.

A former legislator and news reporter, Betty Sue and family have lived in the Salmon Creek area 28 years.

County Charter Freeholders - County Commissioner District No. 1

This November the voters of Clark County will be electing an additional 9 Freeholders to draft a county charter. Twelve Freeholders received a majority of the votes cast for their position in the Primary and were, therefore, elected. Following the November 7th General election, the 21 elected Freeholders will begin meeting to draft a County Charter.

The citizens of Clark County are currently governed by a form of government which is defined by state law and has existed since the State was formed over 100 years ago. This form of government can be replaced with a new form of government, if the citizens of the County decide that it is to their advantage to do so. The first step in the process of changing the current form of County government is to elect a group of 21 Freeholders. Once elected, these Freeholders will have up to three years to draft a county charter, which will define how a new form of County government would function. Once the draft of a county charter is written, it will be submitted to a vote of the citizens. If a majority of the citizens vote for approval of the new county charter the County will change its form of government. If a majority of citizens vote against approval of the new county charter, Clark County will continue with its current form of government. Voters will only be able to vote for Freeholder candidates in their county commissioner district.

Important Precinct Committee Officer information for absentee voters only

Listed below are the names of the candidates who have filed a “Declaration of Candidacy” for the elective position of Precinct Committee Officer. Each major political party is allowed to elect one Precinct Committee Officer for each Precinct in Clark County, every two years.

When two or more members of the same major political party file for a Precinct Committee Officer position in the same Precinct, their names *will* appear on the absentee ballots. However, if only one candidate from each major political party files for a Precinct Committee

Officer position in a Precinct, the candidate’s names *will not* appear on your absentee ballot. They are, however, listed below by Precinct if any absentee voter wishes to cast a vote for Precinct Committee Officer in their Precinct.

If the names of Precinct Committee Officer candidates do not appear on your absentee ballot and if you wish to vote for a Precinct Committee Officer candidate in your Precinct, you will need to punch out the black dot immediately above the number on your punch card ballot which matches

the number to the right of your candidate’s name listed below.

Note: You may only vote for one Precinct Committee Officer in your Precinct.

If you do not know your Precinct number, you will find it listed on the address label with your name printed on the back side of the affidavit envelope (the one with the green edges) included in your absentee ballot packet. If you have any questions, please contact the Elections Department by calling (360) 397-2345.

Statement against:

No, better accountability is needed before more funds are entrusted to the library. Library taxes collected from the combined Battle Ground and Hockinson areas have jumped from about \$880,812 in 1991 to \$1,615,153 in 1999. This maintains the Battle Ground branch and bookmobile stops. For comparison, the Camas library spent \$662,784 in 1998.

Library reserves have grown to a total \$5,033,857 for the whole library district at the end of 1999. Some of these funds should be used to improve local service. Increased hours would be a less expensive means of expansion.

Increase hours open. According to an interview with the library director reported in the Columbian, "It costs relatively little to keep a small branch library open for longer hours, but 'it costs a bundle' to operate the much larger Vancouver or Vancouver Mall libraries for even an extra hour."

The library board has overridden Referendum 47 inflation limits for three years for "substantial needs". One "need" in 1999 was the library director's salary raised to approximately \$118,420. Recently the county commissioner's salary to oversee the entire county was frozen at \$91,224. Over the last 5 years, four assistant library director's salaries have increased 33 - 75%!

Scarce library Internet terminals are used to distribute hardcore pornography to and near youth, without parental permission in many cases. According to library records, patrons have masturbated during and after Internet use and sexual offenders have accessed pornography. Other Washington libraries offer clean Internet service, in response to the communities they serve.

Rebuttal of statement for:

Last year, Reflector editor, Marvin Case, asked, "How can the remodeling of an aging two story building constructed as a church produce as usable a facility as a building designed as a library? GREATER BATTLE GROUND LIBRARY CAPITAL FACILITY AREA CLARK COUNTY, WASHINGTON RESOLUTION NO. 2000-1

RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE GREATER BATTLE GROUND LIBRARY CAPITAL FACILITY AREA REQUESTING THAT THE CLARK COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS CALL FOR AN ELECTION REGARDING A BOND MEASURE TO FINANCE THE REMODEL, EXPANSION, EQUIPPING AND STOCKING OF THE BUILDING THE LIBRARY HAS PURCHASED AT 606 NE 1ST STREET AS A NEW LIBRARY FOR THE GREATER BATTLE GROUND AREA.

WHEREAS, on September 7, 1999, the Fort Vancouver Regional Library District (the "Library District") approved Resolution 1999-11 Second Amendment requesting, among other things, that the Clark County Board of Commissioners (the "County Board of Commissioners") place two propositions, one establishing a library capital facility area (boundaries of which include the Battle Ground School District #119; the Hockinson School District #98, excluding those portions lying within Fire District 5 and 6; and that portion of the Ridgefield School District #122 lying within Fire District 11) to be known as the Greater Battle Ground Library Capital Facility Area (the "GBGLFCA") and one providing for the issuance of general obligation bonds and imposition of an excess levy, on the ballot in the general election held in Clark County on November 2, 1999; and

WHEREAS, on August 2, 1999, the City of Battle Ground adopted Resolution 99-24 requesting the County Board of Commissioners to place two propositions, one establishing the GBGLCFA and one providing for the issuance of general obligation bonds and imposition of an excess levy, on the ballot in the general election held in Clark County on November 2, 1999; and

WHEREAS, on August 2, 1999, the Town of Yacolt adopted a Resolution requesting the County Board of Commissioners to place two propositions, one establishing the GBGLCFA and one providing for the issuance of general obligation bonds and imposition of an excess levy, on the ballot in the general election held in Clark County on November 2, 1999; and

WHEREAS, at such special election, the number and proportion of the voters required by law for the adoption thereof voted in favor of the establishment of the GBGLCFA, but not the issuance of the general obligation

bonds and the imposition of the excess levy; and

WHEREAS, a significant majority of public comment taken at a public meeting held in Battle Ground on April 18, 2000 as well as comments taken from the public since November 1999 urge a second try for a bond measure to fund the remodel and expansion of the new library facility; and

WHEREAS, the portion of the bond costs for books and library materials being requested is \$500,000 less than what was brought to the voters in November 1999; and

WHEREAS, to make up for the reduction in the bond amount, the Board of Trustees of Fort Vancouver Regional Library pledge, as a District contribution, the net proceeds of a future sale of the current Battle Ground library building; additionally, the Board has challenged the greater Battle Ground community to match its contribution by raising \$250,000; and

WHEREAS, the Friends of the Battle Ground Community Library has accepted the Library Board's challenge; and

WHEREAS, on May 15, 2000, the Library District adopted Resolution No. 2000-10 requesting the GBGLCFA Governing Body and the County Board of Commissioners to call for an election regarding a bond measure to finance the remodel, expansion, equipping and stocking of the building the library has purchased at 606 NE 1st Street as a new library for the greater Battle Ground area; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to RCW 27.15.050 and RCW 39.36.050, the Governing Body of the GBGLCFA and the County Board of Commissioners are authorized to submit such proposition to the voters at a general or special election;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Governing Body of the Greater Battle Ground Library Capital Facility Area hereby requests the Clark County Board of County Commissioners submit the following ballot proposition to the voters within the Greater Battle Ground Library Capital Facility Area at the next general election in substantially the following form:

Proposition: Shall the Greater Battle Ground Library Capital Facility Area, Clark County, Washington, incur indebtedness and issue not more than \$3.8 million of general obligation bonds maturing within 15 years and levy annual excess property taxes necessary to pay and retire such bonds to finance the remodel, expansion, equipping and stocking of the building the Library has purchased at 606 NE 1st Street as a new library for the Greater

Battle Ground area?
