BENEFIT AREA AUTHORITY (C-TRAN)**

C-TRAN, Clark County Public Transportation Benefit Area Authority, in adopting Resolution #BR-05-021, authorizes a proposition to increase the sales and use tax by 0.2 percent, or two cents on a \$10.00 purchase, to preserve C-TRAN local fixed route, commuter, and demand response service (C-VAN and the Camas Connector) in the City of Vancouver and its urban growth boundary, and the city limits only of Camas, Washougal, and Battle Ground; and to restore service to the cities of La Center and Ridgefield, the Town of Yacolt, and the WSU - Vancouver campus.

The Board of Directors of Battle Ground School District No. 119 adopted Resolution No. M-05, concerning a proposition to finance and construct a new high school. This proposition would authorize the District to relieve overcrowding by constructing a new North County High School that will include science and technology labs, library, performing arts center, gym, track and practice fields, and other capital improvements; issue no more than \$20,390,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within 21 years; and levy annual excess property taxes to pay and retire the bonds, all as provided in Resolution No. M-05. WOODLAND SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 404-102
GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS - \$3,750,000**

The Board of the Woodland School District No. 404-102 passed Resolution #2492 concerning this proposition for bonds. This proposition authorizes the District to acquire a site for a new high school and if funds are sufficient, undertake design work and make other site improvements, issue \$3,750,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within a maximum term of 20 years, and levy excess property taxes annually to repay such bonds, all as provided in Resolution #2492.
