NOTE TO VOTERS

This sample ballot contains all candidates who have filed for office and will appear in the Primary and Special election on August 7. You will **not** be entitled to vote on all races and issues that appear on this ballot. When you vote only the candidates and any local measure that applies to your precinct will be listed on your ballot.

Ballot deposit locations are open from 7 AM to 8 PM, election day only.

Additional assistance is available to any voter who is unable to properly vote their ballot due to disability or who wishes to vote their ballot without assistance. MAKE SURE YOUR VOTE COUNTS.

Before you begin voting, please take the time to read through all of the voting instructions printed on the ballot you receive and the instructions printed on the other materials included in your ballot packet. The voting instructions for this election are unique and by understanding them thoroughly you will make sure your vote counts.

Voting Instructions:

- 1) Your ballot must be voted in secret and shown to no one.
- 2) Use a black or blue ink pen to mark your ballot by completely filling in the box to the left of your choice(s).
- 3) Vote for only one choice for each office or ballot measure. Unless specifically allowed by law, more than one vote for an office or ballot measure will be an overvote and no votes for that office or ballot measure will be counted.
- 4) To vote for a person not appearing on the ballot, completely fill in the box to the left of the "Write-in" choice and use the line provided for their name. This does not apply to the precinct committee officer position, if one appears on your ballot.
- 5) If you make a mistake when voting, completely cross out the name of the candidate or choice you do not want. You then have the option of making another choice.

ELECTION OF PRECINCT COMMITTEE OFFICERS

For this office only: In order to vote for precinct committee officer, a partisan office, you must affirm that you are a Democrat or a Republican and may vote only for one candidate from the party you select. Your vote for a candidate affirms your affiliation with the same party as the candidate. This preference is private and will not be matched to your name or shared.

PRECINCT COMMITTEE OFFICER PRECINCT NO. _____

For precinct committee officer positions the only candidates who will have their name appear on the ballot are where they are one of two or more candidates of the same party who filed as a precinct committee officer for the same precinct. If only one candidate of either the Democratic or Republican Party files for precinct committee officer in a precinct, they will be deemed elected to the office and their name will not appear on the ballot. No write-in votes for precinct committee officer positions are allowed. Precinct committee officers are elected in this election and will not appear on the General election ballot.
