City of Woodland Clark County Fire Protection District 2 Clark County Fire Protection District 11 DBA Clark County Fire and Rescue Proposition No. 1

The City of Woodland, Clark County Fire Protection District 2 and Clark County Fire Protection District 11 -DBA Clark County Fire and Rescue have adopted Joint Resolution No. 651 approving the Clark County Regional Fire Authority Plan ("Plan") concerning creation of the Clark County Regional Fire Authority.

If this measure is approved, it would approve the Plan and create the Clark County Regional Fire Authority, effective July 1, 2015, to provide regional fire protection and emergency medical services funded with a property tax not to exceed \$1.50/\$1,000 assessed value and other sources identified in the Plan. City and District levies would be reduced to offset the Fire Authority's levy.
