Replacement of Expiring Educational Programs,

The Board of Directors of Battle Ground School District No. 119 adopted Resolution No. A-13, concerning a proposition for a replacement levy for education. This proposition would authorize the District to meet the educational needs of students by levying the following excess taxes, in place of an expiring levy, on all taxable property within the District, for support of the District's General Fund educational programs, maintenance and operation expenses:

Capital Fund Levy

The La Center School District Board adopted Resolution 2012/2013-4, concerning athletic facility needs for middle and high school students, to include bleachers, field lighting, announcing booth and scoreboards, and other options as described in the Resolution. This proposition would authorize \$200,000 per year for six years, and would allow the District to levy the following excess taxes on all taxable property in the District, for the purpose of supporting the District's Athletic Facilities:
