#### NOTE TO VOTERS

You will **not** be entitled to vote on all races and issues that appear on this ballot. When you vote only the candidates and local measures that apply to your precinct will be listed on your ballot.

For the August 16, 2011 Primary and Special election, some registered voters in Clark County will not have any candidate races or ballot issues on which to vote. They will not be receiving a ballot for this election.

Ballot deposit locations are open from 7 AM to 8 PM, election day only.

- 1) Your ballot must be voted in secret and shown to no one.
- 2) Use a black or blue ink pen to mark your ballot by completely filling in the box to the left of your choice(s).
- 3) Vote for only one choice for each office or ballot measure. Unless specifically allowed by law, more than one vote for an office or ballot measure will be an overvote and no votes for that office or ballot measure will be counted.
- 4) To vote for a person not appearing on the ballot, completely fill in the box to the left of the "Write-in" choice and use the line provided for their name.
- 5) If you make a mistake when voting, completely cross out the name of the candidate or choice you do not want. You then have the option of making another choice.
