The Board of the Woodland School District No. 404-102 adopted Resolution #2512 authorizing the district to issue general obligation bonds no more than \$49,400,000 to relieve overcrowding by constructing a new high school. The proposition would also allow the district to upgrade the existing stadium to increase seating and parking, make improvements to current schools, upgrade technology for students and address other necessary capital improvements. The general obligation bonds would mature within a maximum term of 21 years, and property taxes would be levied annually to repay such bonds, all as provided in Resolution No. 2512.
