VOTING INSTRUCTIONS

MAKE SURE YOUR VOTE COUNTS.

Before you begin voting, please read all of the voting instructions printed below, those printed on your ballot and the instructions printed on the other materials included in your ballot packet. By understanding the voting instructions thoroughly you will make sure your vote is counted.

WHEN VOTING:

- 1) Your ballot must be voted in secret and shown to no one.
- 2) Use a black or blue ink pen to mark your ballot by completely filling in the box to the left of your choice.
- Unless specifically allowed by law, more than one vote for a ballot measure will be an overvote and no votes for that ballot measure will be counted.
- 4) If you make a mistake when voting, you may request a replacement ballot by calling the Elections Department at (360) 397-2345. Or, you may correct it using the instructions printed on the yellow secrecy envelope included in the ballot packet mailed to you.
- 5) After you finish voting, review your choice to be sure you marked the ballot as you intended.
- 6) Do not make any mark of identification on the ballot or secrecy envelope. If you make a mark of identification on your ballot, such as signing your name, the ballot will <u>not</u> be counted.
- 7) Refold your voted ballot and place it in the yellow secrecy envelope.
- 8) Place the sealed yellow secrecy envelope containing your voted ballot into the affidavit envelope with the green stripes included in the ballot packet mailed to you.
- 9) Read the Affidavit of Voter oath on the return envelope with the green stripes, then sign the affidavit oath and date it on the lines provided. YOUR BALLOT WILL NOT BE COUNTED IF YOU DO NOT SIGN THE OATH ON THE AFFIDAVIT ENVELOPE.
- 10) Attach sufficient first class postage (\$0.42) and mail your ballot so that it will be postmarked by election day or sooner.
- 11) If you choose not to mail your ballot, you may take it to one of the ballot deposit locations listed on the voting instruction sheet included with the ballot packet mailed to you. The ballot deposit locations will be staffed by election workers and will be open from 7 AM until 8 PM, on Election Day, Tuesday, May 20 only.
- 12) For voters who wish to vote without assistance, accessible voting equipment is available at the Elections Department.
