SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION, MODERNIZATION AND

The Board of Directors of Battle Ground School District No. 119 adopted Resolution No. E-04, concerning a proposition to relieve overcrowding by constructing and renovating school facilities. This proposition would authorize the District to construct and equip two new K-8 campuses, replace three existing schools and make additions and modifications to other existing schools, facilities and sites; issue no more than \$54,980,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within 20 years; and levy annual excess property taxes to pay and retire the bonds, all as provided in Resolution No. E-04. The Board of the Woodland School District No. 404-102 passed Resolution #2484 concerning this proposition. This proposition authorizes the District to acquire a site and construct a new high school, convert the Woodland Middle/High Schools to a middle school and ancillary District facilities, upgrade the stadium and increase stadium parking, issue \$33,935,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within a maximum term of 20 years, and levy property taxes annually, in addition to regular tax levies, to repay such bonds, all as provided in Resolution #2484. (This shall not be construed to authorize an excess levy and shall be subject to otherwise applicable statutory limits.)
