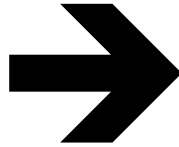


# OFFICIAL SAMPLE BALLOT

### NOTE TO VOTERS

This sample ballot contains all candidates who have filed for office and will appear at the Primary on September 14th. You will **not** be entitled to vote on all races and issues that appear on this ballot. When you vote only the races and issues that apply to your precinct will be listed. Every voter is eligible to cast votes in the nonpartisan races and local measures that apply to them. Each voter will receive four ballots for this election but they will only be allowed to vote one ballot. For more information please read the next page of this sample ballot.

## **IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT VOTING IN THE NEW PRIMARY**

For this election each voter will receive four separate ballots, one for each of the three major political parties plus a nonpartisan ballot. The voter must choose only one ballot to vote.

Polling place voters will receive ballots with a color stripe. The red stripe is on the Democratic ballot, the green stripe is on the Republican ballot and the blue stripe is on the Libertarian ballot.

Absentee voters will receive ballots that are a solid color. The red ballot is the Democratic ballot, the green ballot is the Republican ballot and the blue ballot is the Libertarian ballot.

Though party affiliation is inferred by choosing a political party ballot, no record will be made of the ballot each voter chooses.

The voter is allowed to vote only one ballot. If more than one political party ballot is voted and returned, none of the votes for political party candidates will count.

Every voter may vote on the nonpartisan races and local measures that apply to them, regardless of any party affiliation. If a voter **does not** wish to vote in a political party primary they should use the fourth white ballot to vote only for nonpartisan offices and local measures.

If a voter chooses to vote a political party ballot, they will also need to vote for the nonpartisan candidates and local measures which apply to them on the political party ballot they have chosen.

Nonpartisan candidates are those who are not required to provide a party label when they file for office. They include Superintendent of Public Instruction as well as all judicial offices and local measures.
