The Board of Directors of Green Mountain School District No. 103 adopted Resolution No. 11-19-02, concerning a proposition to finance school program maintenance expenses. This proposition would authorize a levy of \$150,000 for 2004, \$155,000 for 2005 and \$160,000 for 2006 requiring approximately \$1.93 per thousand dollars of assessed valuation be collected, for Green Mountain School District to fund high school tuition payments to other districts, to fund payments for the education of the multihandicapped, transportation, maintenance and operational expenses.
