This proposition authorizes the District to construct and modernize classrooms, support and athletic facilities, make safety and site improvements to South Ridge and Union Ridge Elementaries, View Ridge Middle and Ridgefield High Schools, and make other capital improvements; to issue \$47,000,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within a maximum term of 20 years; and to levy excess property taxes annually to repay the bonds, as described in Resolution #2011-2012-001.
