






Background - Transportation System Plan









Background – Age distribution








Background – Weekday Trips










Proposed Public Participation Plan - Goals

- Actively solicit information from residents, property owners and stakeholders about their concerns, questions and priorities for TSP review process.
- Consult and consider recommendations from neighboring jurisdictions, federal and state agencies, and Native American tribes indigenous to Clark County.
- Encourage interested parties to informally and formally review and comment on the proposed TSP throughout the process and provide those comments to decision makers.
- Meet qualifications under State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA), RCW 43.21.
- Provide:
 - interested parties with timely information, an understanding of the process, and multiple opportunities to review and comment on proposed TSP.
 - accommodation and opportunities for community involvement to all Clark County communities that promotes and honors diversity, equity and inclusion.
 - opportunities for formal public input at project milestones prior to decision-making by local officials.
