## BACKGROUND

Currently, all new Sheriff's Office deputies must attend Basic Law Enforcement Academy training at the state's Criminal Justice Training Center near Seattle. This requires a roughly five-month commitment away from home, which is a substantial challenge for many applicants. Additionally, the waitlist to attend the academy is historically long, delaying an applicant's ability to begin their new position and leading to considerable uncertainty for the applicant and the Sheriff's Office.

In July, 2022, Governor Inslee and Senator Lovick announced plans to pursue legislation to create regional police academies across Washington state, including in the Vancouver area. The intent is to increase training capacity and to attract quality people that otherwise cannot commit to a five-month stay at the current CJTC training center locations near Seattle and Spokane.

## **COUNCIL POLICY IMPLICATIONS**

The proposed Resolution expresses support for a regional CJTC facility in Clark County, stating that such a facility will better serve our region, remove barriers for applicants that cannot stay away from home for five months, and expand training capacity for law enforcement statewide.

#### ADMINISTRATIVE POLICY IMPLICATIONS

None. The operation of the regional academy would be performed by the CJTC.

3	A RESOLUTION expressing the County Council's support for a Criminal Justice
4	Training Commission ("CJTC") expansion to add a regional law enforcement training
5	center in Clark County.
6	WHEREAS, law enforcement and criminal justice professionals are essential to
7	ensuring public safety; and
8	WHEREAS, for the past several years, law enforcement agencies across
9	Washington state and the nation have experienced an increase in law enforcement
10	resignations, retirements, and a decrease in applications and new hires; and
11	WHEREAS, the Clark County Sheriff's Office consistently has had unfilled law
12	enforcement positions despite best recruitment efforts;
13	WHEREAS, challenges with recruitment and retention are likely to persist for the
14	foreseeable future due to the large percentage of Clark County Sheriff's Office staff that
15	will soon become eligible for retirement; and
16	WHEREAS, agencies across southwest Washington need to recruit new law
17	enforcement professionals, and new law enforcement professionals all must receive
18	training at the CJTC's Basic Law Enforcement Academy ("BLEA"); and
19	WHEREAS, in July 2022, Governor Jay Inslee announced his work with Sen.
20	John Lovick to pursue legislative approval to create regional police training academies
21	across Washington state in order to attract quality people who can commute to and from
22	an academy every day and who will then serve their own communities upon graduation;
23	and

24	WHEREAS, part of Governor Inslee and Sen. Lovick's vision is to create a
25	regional public safety training academy in southwest Washington, which will strongly
26	enhance the Clark County Sheriff's Office's ability to recruit and retain future law
27	enforcement officers from the greater southwest Washington area; and
28	WHEREAS, removing the barrier for new applicants of living five months away
29	from their families in order to attend the BLEA increases opportunities for those who
30	may not be able to spend that amount of time away from home; and
31	WHEREAS, a local regional public safety academy improves community
32	engagement and outreach efforts by increasing equitable access to all; and
33	WHEREAS, as southwest Washington communities continue to grow and our
34	population density increases, a long-term investment from the State of Washington
35	ensures a strong CJTC relationship; and
36	WHEREAS, a southwest Washington CJTC training facility will allow for all
37	local law enforcement agencies to provide state-mandated training, such as I-940
38	requirements, and de-escalation training; and
39	WHERAS, a southwest Washington contemporary regional training facility gives
40	the public a strong vision of investment in community safety, and of careers for those
41	who choose a life of service to others.

Dear Governor Inslee and Senator Lovick:

Enclosed please find a copy of the Clark County Council's recently adopted Resolution in full support of the legislative proposal to create regional police academies, including in southwest Washington. We sincerely appreciate your commitment to addressing the current barriers to ensure our ability to equitably recruit and train future law enforcement officers across Washington state. We fully agree with you that it is beneficial to attract quality people within a 50-mile radius who can commute to and from a training academy every day, who will then serve their own communities upon graduation. It is highly valuable to remove the barrier for new applicants to live five-months away from their families in order to attend the required Basic Law Enforcement Academy (BLEA).

The County Council further fully supports the proposal to include southwest Washington as one of the proposed locations for a regional academy. Our communities in Clark County and throughout southwest Washington continue to grow, while simultaneously we are facing a large percentage of our staff eligible for retirement in the coming few years. These pressures will only increase the need for new law enforcement officers that will require BLEA training.

We welcome the opportunity to collaborate with you, the CJTC, our legislative delegation, and community stakeholders to develop plans for a suitable facility location. We know that our cooperation and partnership in establishing a local regional training academy will enhance the law enforcement profession, increase inclusion, and improve safety for all residents of Washington state.
